1. How can we identify friends of peace? (Luke 10:6)

(Luke 10:6) And if a friend of peace is there, your peace will rest upon him. But if there is not, it will return to you.

2. How can we help friends of peace become friends of God? (Matt. 10:11)

(Matthew 10:11) "Into whatever city or village you enter, search out who in it is deserving, and stay there until you leave.

3. How does the Prince of Peace help us find friends of peace? (Isa. 9:6, 7; Matt. 28:20)

(Isaiah 9:6, 7) For a child has been born to us, A son has been given to us; And the rulership will rest on his shoulder. His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace. 7 To the increase of his rulership And to peace, there will be no end, On the throne of David and on his kingdom In order to establish it firmly and to sustain it Through justice and righteousness, From now on and forever. The zeal of Jehovah of armies will do this.

(Matthew 28:20) teaching them to observe all the things I have commanded you. And look! I am with you all the days until the conclusion of the system of things."

4. How can we prove that we are friends of peace? (Ps. 11:5; 2 Tim. 2:24; Jas. 3:17, 18)

(Psalm 11:5) Jehovah examines the righteous one as well as the wicked one; He hates anyone who loves violence.

(2 Timothy 2:24) For a slave of the Lord does not need to fight, but needs to be gentle toward all, qualified to teach, showing restraint when wronged,

(James 3:17, 18) But the wisdom from above is first of all pure, then peaceable, reasonable, ready to obey, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial, not hypocritical. 18 Moreover, the fruit of righteousness is sown in peaceful conditions for those who are making peace.

5. How do friends of peace help one another? (2 Cor. 6:13)

(2 Corinthians 6:13) So in response—I speak as to my children—you too open your hearts wide.

6. How can we “keep conquering the evil with the good”? (Rom. 12:2, 6, 10, 18)

(Romans 12:2) And stop being molded by this system of things, but be transformed by making your mind over, so that you may prove to yourselves the good and acceptable and perfect will of God.

(Romans 12:6) Since, then, we have gifts that differ according to the undeserved kindness given to us, if it is of prophecy, let us prophesy in proportion to our faith;

(Romans 12:10) In brotherly love have tender affection for one another. In showing honor to one another, take the lead.

(Romans 12:18) If possible, as far as it depends on you, be peaceable with all men.
